To the Class of 2025, you have navigated your studies with grace and grit. We cannot wait to see the impact you will make in the world.

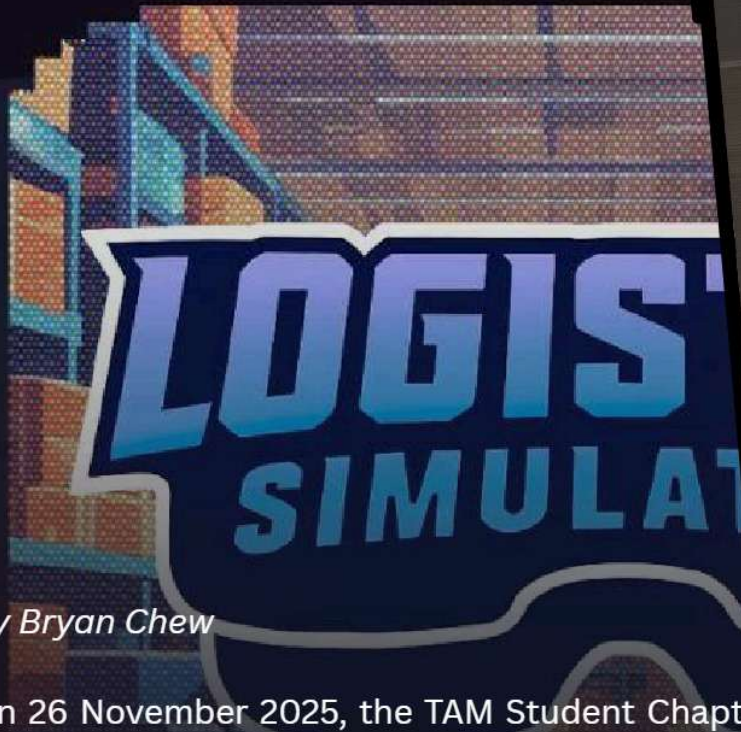

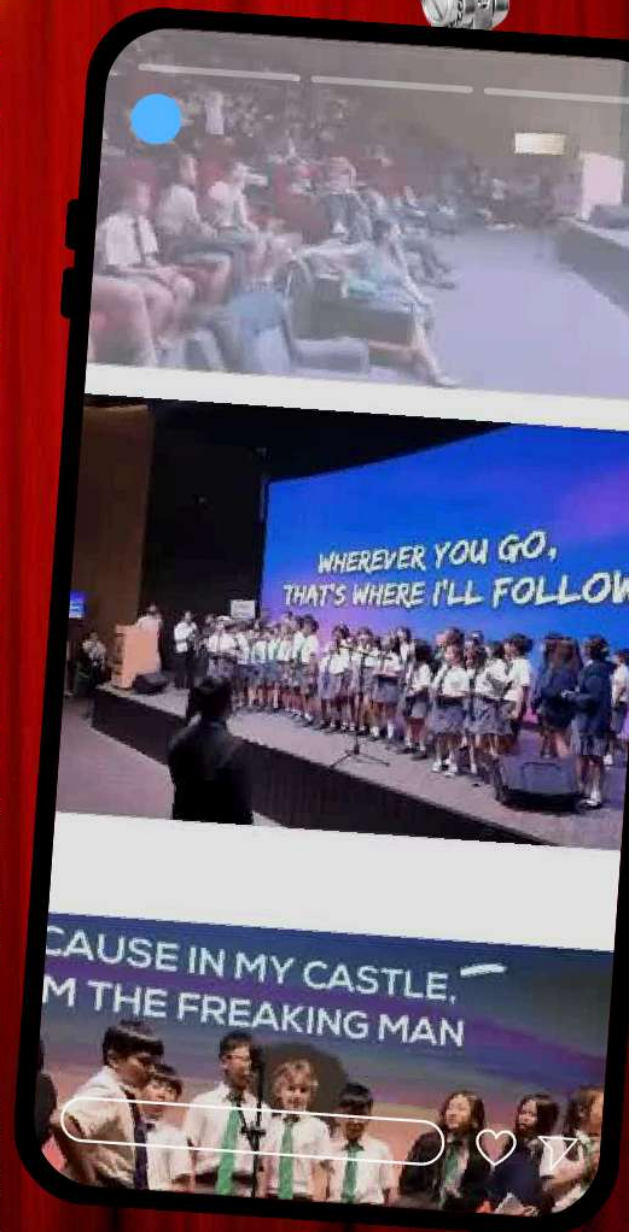
World Singing Day
